It is located just outside the main doors to the Fellowship Hall. PVES & WMC relationship

For the past year and a half Waterford has the nee solidified its relationship with Prairie View a special Elementary School along with our partner church and he Maple City Chapel. This has grown out of a desire of the Goshen Community Schools for all the elementary schools in Goshen to be partnered with two local churches.

We are currently involved in two activities with the school. One is the approval of a \$500 fund given to the school in a special account from which teachers can request money for special projects not covered by the school budget. Our own member, Marge Gingerich, the school counselor, is a direct link to this fund and will work with a committee from the school to decide which projects will be funded. Examples from last year are funds for an incubator and a request for transportation for a field trip. Maple City funded these two projects out of discretionary funds that were readily available. Our fund now makes money quickly and easily available for special projects with a priority given to ones that benefit a whole class or group of students. The first \$500 has been given to the school, and the system will be evaluated by the Mission and Service Ministry Team to decide if the church will want to replenish the fund.

The second activity that happened on October 13 was a meal for the teachers during their fall parent/teacher conferences. That day is a long one with the teachers having students the first part of the day and then conferences into the evening.

These are some other activities that happened in the past:

- Providing a meal at the beginning of the year for the past two years
- Providing a meal for conferences
- Assisting with the book fair
- Sorting boxes for the PTO fund-raiser
- Providing academic support
- Reading to a class for thirty minutes for four weeks with the Real Men Read initiative funded through United Way and expanding that for an additional four-week session in January
- For women participating in Spring into Reading that takes place in the spring
- Conducting an underwear drive
- Conducting a facial tissue drive
- Providing treats and notes during May
- Assisting with field day.

We are looking to the future to discover how this relationship can grow. Connecting people with the needs is the on-going challenge. If you have a special interest in helping, let Len Harms know, and he can begin to form a list of people readily available to help. The organizing committee for this partnership is Jane Otto, Fancheon Resler, and Len Harms.

Sharing fund report

Waterford Mennonite Church (WMC) has an active Sharing Fund which is an extension of our pastoral care ministry as it provides financial assistance to active participants at WMC who are experiencing financial hardship. The fund is facilitated by two cocoordinators appointed by the pastoral team.

The Sharing Fund is an above budget account, and therefore we are deeply grateful to all who contribute to this ministry on a regular basis. During the past quarter, June through September, the Sharing Fund assisted 5 individuals or families with a total of \$8,093.72 The Everence Sharing Fund matches our disbursements up to \$3,000 in grants annually and has returned \$2,944.95 to our Sharing Fund account this year.

The details of Sharing Fund activity are, of course, confidential, but we do want to share with the congregation the amount of money that was distributed during this period. Because this is a significant ministry among us, we want all to be aware of this resource. The fund is available to regular attenders experiencing financial hardship and can be accessed by contacting one of the co-coordinators, pastors or class shepherds.

As this is an above-budget fund, we welcome contributions to our Sharing Fund at any time. We routinely receive an offering for our Sharing Fund when we observe Communion (usually 4 times a year); however, anyone may make a contribution to the account at any time noting "Sharing Fund" on their check and/or envelope.
