Praying Companions is an intergenerational group of 3-10 women who are learning to "let go and let God." Each of us has gone through challenging life experiences that have caused us to question where God is in our circumstances. Many of us struggle with the perception that the church is full of people who have their lives together. Since the lives we expected have crumbled under our feet, we wonder if we belong in the church. This Sunday school class dispenses with superficiality and creates a place to be real. Because we respect the confidentiality of what is shared in our class, we are able to drop our masks and pray each other through life's challenges.

There is not a lot of structure in our Sunday school hour and attendance is fluid, because many of us travel often (for work or to keep up family relationships). We usually begin with a meditation, followed by exchanging our joys, answered prayers, and, yes, even miracles! We also tell each other about our challenges and fears. We stay engaged through the week with emails to report new twists and turns in our lives and share the joy of outcomes better than we could have imagined. We have had several weekend retreats with a resource person, book or theme and a more extended time of sharing and prayer. (We also laugh a lot.)

We welcome any woman who wants to join our class, whether it is just for one Sunday for sharing a burden you are carrying, or if you would like to spend more time with us – you will be received into a place of love and acceptance.
