"Fundraising" vs. "Faithraising"

Last week, Pastor Neil described our desire as a congregation to make our physical spaces more welcoming to people. He also named that we will be approaching this as a "faithraising" project rather than as "fundraising." So, what's the difference?

In many ways, churches can and should operate like other businesses and non-profits. For example, it is good for us to have administrative policies and control mechanisms in place that help us avoid fiscal malpractice.

In other ways, churches are different. In traditional fundraising campaigns, for example, the emphasis is on total dollars raised. This leads to development officers efficiently focusing their time on the small number of donors with the most giving potential.

But in "faithraising," we recognize that the church belongs to all who know God's grace, and the emphasis is on encouraging everyone to grow in their faith formation, including in generosity. Faithraising asks, "Grounded in gratitude for the gracious God we serve, and revealed in a life of prayer, how might we all be called to generously live out our faith?" As consultant Lori Guenthor Reesor says, "Ten dollars from me and \$499,990 from you is not a successful church capital campaign."

In fact, Reesor goes a step further. She describes the goals of a "faithraising" project as these:


- 1. Strengthen discipleship by teaching generosity.
- 2. Grow an inclusive community by encouraging everyone to give as they are able.
- 3. Celebrate the joy of working together towards a common vision.
- 4. Raise money.

"I'm confident that a church full of joyful givers achieves the last goal," she says. "But even if they cannot, a joyful community of generous disciples who celebrate what God is doing in their midst sounds like a wonderful failure to be part of."

Changes at Goshen Interfaith Hospitality Network

It was eight months ago that Goshen Interfaith Hospitality Network (GIHN) moved guest hosting to St. Mark's United Methodist Church building. GIHN Executive Director Mindy Morehead reports that things are operating fairly smoothly, and since moving to the fixed site, 31 different families and 19 single females have been served.

However, one challenge they have noticed is that due to the fluctuation in the number of guests attending meals, meal preparation has become more difficult. They understand this completely and have tried to figure out how to make it easier for everyone. Faith Mission Executive Director Ross Swihart has offered to provide the dinners every night at no cost to GIHN except transporting meals from Elkhart to St. Mark's. Mindy has decided to accept this offer for a two month trial, beginning September 9, so that each church will have an opportunity to serve Faith Mission meals and see how this system works. They will still need volunteers nightly to serve the dinner and eat with our guests, and then be there with the guests until the overnight guard shows up.

Additionally, GIHN has decided to provide additional volunteer training over the next three months. They are asking that each volunteer pick from the following dates to attend one of the training sessions, all held at St. Mark's United Methodist Church: September 25, October 31 and November 30.

During these sessions volunteers will be asked to sign a volunteer waiver and a background check form.
