

Visiting Benin After Fifty Years

I remember well my first travel outside the United States Christmas 1970. I was a college senior, and I was going to Zaire (Congo) to visit Eldon. Being a minority white person for the first time and surrounded by indigenous African people newly free from colonial rule struck me immediately. Intrigued, I soaked in all I could though I understood none of the French or other languages spoken around me.

Amazingly, it was in 1969 the first Mennonites were invited to partner with African Initiated Churches in Benin. Imagine with me this long-term partnership initiated by visionary African Christian leaders. From the beginning mutuality and holistic witness was its goal! For many years while working at Mennonite Board of Missions and Mennonite Mission Network (MMN), I read and listened to reports of mission workers who were assisting at Benin Bible Institute, La Casa Grande, and responding to other needs. Benin has been in my prayers for many years.

Now nearly fifty years from my first introduction to the African continent, and after my MMN work experience, I am eager for this opportunity to visit Benin and the sisters and brothers who are partners with MMN, Africa Inter-Mennonite Mission, and with us here at Waterford Mennonite Church. Having Lynda and Rod Hollinger-Janzen at WMC has enabled us not only to hear them speak about continued work by Beninese leaders, we've met and hosted visitors from Benin. What a privilege it is to be able to visit them!

I go as a believer in holistic mission partnerships, a learner of cultural differences and commonalities. I look forward to new sounds, smells and tastes. Although I still do not speak French, I hope to attune my ear and my heart to the daily experiences of our

hosts, joys and sorrows, prayers and praises. I will seek connection especially with women and children. I will seek to bless them even as I am greatly blessed.

As I go, I ask for your prayers, especially for sensitivity to the Holy Spirit, for health to fully experience the hospitality offered, and safety as I push the limits of my achy knees.


Juan Pacheco to Speak at HOPE Meeting
