

Stephen Ministers Gather for Annual Retreat

Pathways Retreat, on the north edge of Goshen, provided the setting for the congregation's Stephen Ministers, Stephen Leaders, and Pastor Terry to gather for their annual half-day retreat on Saturday, November 9.

Stephen Leader Liz Gingrich guided the group in reflecting on her Celtic pilgrimage of last summer in the United Kingdom. She shared how Stephen Ministers might connect with Celtic Christian spirituality in ways they might find useful in more deeply sensing the presence of God in their everyday experiences. Among the concepts considered, participants reflected on the topic of "thin spaces," where the visible world and transcendent meet; and "thresholds," marking times of transition including those of life changes and Stephen Ministers gather to pray for each other as they
