



Have you heard about the MYF O-Lent-ic games?

It was winter and the beginning of Lent when MYF students and sponsors began dreaming up creative ways to thrive together during a pandemic winter in Goshen, Indiana. The creative juices began to flow as we started to dream of an in-house tournament. Students would win points for their team through participation in various activities, looking forward to the grand prize: the polar plunge. Or, better put, the winning team will watch the losing teams and sponsors dive into the wetlands after the tournament.

Students received a player's manual with rules and challenges, ready to begin Ash Wednesday for the O-lent-ics opening ceremonies. There was a carrying- of-the-torch-video, and the three teams designed their logos. The games kicked off with fun video calls each Wins-day night, where teams competed in various challenges including online escape rooms, trivia, minute-to-win-it games, push-up competitions, and more.

How does one play and win the O-lent-ics? Students earn points in the following ways:

POP-IN points

5 points - just for showing up streak points - for consecutive Sundays and Wednesdays 10 bonus points - for bringing a friend Wins-day - Wednesday night team competitions 75 points - for 1st place 30 points - for 2nd place

WMC regularly gives to Prairie View Elementary School through the SOS program as part of our outreach giving.

I was so excited to receive the SOS grant money, which has allowed me and the students I serve a year subscription to Mightier, an evidence-based biofeedback video game designed to improve emotional management.

I received the program and started using it with a handful of students last week. Immediately after introduction to the game, I witnessed a student transferring calming strategies and vocabulary from the game to real-time classroom situations. The game uses the analogy that players can be unpredictable like active volcanoes. It measures and displays their heart rates as they engage in increasingly challenging tasks. Players earn snowflakes points by using coping skills to regulate their emotional reaction to the game. Players are not allowed to move forward in the game until their heart rate is managed.

I am so appreciative of your support and the opportunity to provide this resource to the students I serve. Positive results are in the making. It certainly does indeed take a village (and a church)!
