The main reason for this note is to thank you all and each of you who helped me out by raising funds for my new liners and new feet. I am so






very thankful for it. Especially to Pathfinder Sunday School class who since day one has been looking after me so I can find meaning to my life and feel good about myself.

Matching gift update – halfway there!

At the May 16 congregational meeting and in the following week's *Buzz*, it was announced that a household in the congregation has agreed to match the next \$20,000 contributed toward our Welcoming Spaces 3.0 projects.

To date, we are more than halfway there, having received just over \$10,000 in the ensuing weeks. The first gift even happened *during* the congregational meeting, with a household logging on to https://waterfordchurch.org/giving/ to contribute. That amount also includes gifts from three families who made thei first gift to the Welcoming Spaces 3.0

campaign, bringing the number of households who have given to 66.

If you have not yet given to Welcoming Spaces 3.0, or haven't given for a while, please consider contributing through the regular channels — a check in the offering or sent to the church, the online portal, or through a Qualified Charitable Distribution or Donor Advised Fund gift.
