The goal is to have another adult to talk to and know our youth. As a church, we recognize that so much of identity formation happens through relationship with people of different ages. Some mentor pairs connect very regularly in person, some over technology, some only as needs arise. Depending on the pair, there is flexibility on how this relationship will function, and many have found these relationships to be very meaningful. Each year, there are quarterly gatherings (some years a little more or less often) offered for pairs for an established space and time to reconnect. Once the youth graduates from high school, the mentoring expectations are released, and it is up to the youth and adult to check in with one another if and when they want to, recognizing a shift in relationship happens in young adulthood. SAUSAGE TENT:

Ken Otto will be chairing the booth this year. He is hoping to find some younger workers who will learn the workings of the booth and eventually take the chairperson responsibility. Sausage is fried for sausage sandwiches and sausage for the Saturday morning breakfast. Approximately 20 volunteers, working two-hour shifts are used throughout the weekend. Volunteers' primary job is to arrange cut links of sausage in the baskets to be fried. Someone else does the frying. The work is not heavy.

DAIRY BAR:

Aaron Lehman and Alan Zimmerman chair this booth. Menno tea, pop, water and ice cream are sold. Approximately 20 – 24 volunteers, working two-hour shifts are used throughout the weekend.

POPCORN:

Kevin and Lorene Miller provide leadership for this booth, which sells various Yoder Popcorn products to take home as well as freshly popped for eating at the sale. Additionally, children and parents roam the Saturday auctions, selling popcorn and drinks. Approximately 12 adults/youth and 8 – 10 children are needed to work in two-hour shifts throughout the weekend. Please consider if you would like to volunteer for one of these areas.
