More missional ministries from budget surplus

In the October 3 issue of Buzz, we reported on potential distributions for various ministries from our 2020-21 budget surplus. A total of \$44,000 of that surplus was designated to be given away for ministries serving people outside of Waterford, as decided by the Mission and Service Ministry Team (MSMT). In October \$11,100 from surplus funds (matching other private donations) supported housing assistance for Haitians and resettlement help for Afghan people. Then an additional \$6000 made advanced degree training for a new Benin Bible Institute faculty member possible, thus totaling over \$17,000 of surplus moneys going to ministries around the world.

MSMT is happy to share some additional ministries to which \$13,500 of surplus funds will go yet in 2021:

\$5000 to Amigo Centre (Sturgis MI) for major clean-up costs incurred from the storm in August that damaged trees, trails and buildings

\$2500 to MCC Great Lakes (Goshen) as holder of a fund to create and expand public signage in Elkhart County identifying the traditional lands and trails of the Potawatomi and Miami peoples for centuries, to be overseen by a local coordinating group from various congregations.

\$2500 for creating and expanding displays on Waterford Mennonite Church property for land acknowledgment and describing the history of indigenous peoples on the land where the church sits now. This will be overseen by the new Dismantling Doctrine of Discovery working group.

\$2500 to La Posada Immigrant Aid (Elkhart) for startup costs for this ministry, initiated by Anabaptist churches, for providing affordable legal assistance and language learning for immigrants in Elkhart County

\$1000 to National Immigrant Justice Center (Goshen and Chicago) in support of its ongoing good work locally and beyond for affordable legal assistance to immigrants

Thanks be to God for the blessing of being able to generously support so many ministries both near and far away. As MSMT processes the received suggestions for the remaining surplus funds, we will communicate to the congregation where else that money is going.
