Seeking God's Ways: Worship and Practices for Lent

This year's Lenten theme is "Seeking God's Ways" which is drawn from Isaiah 55:8 – "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord." Throughout the Lenten journey we will look at different paradoxes we find in scripture and in our own lives. As we dig into the lectionary texts we will find examples of how humans have often misunderstood God's intention or God's ways. For example, we think God offers one thing, when what God offers is actually quite different. You will see the reality of this paradox in the theme for each Sunday included below.

Lent is the season of the church that is set aside for prayerful reflection as we prepare to faithfully follow Jesus through the events of Holy Week. Therefore, during our worship services there will be time for prayers of confession as well as words of assurance of God's forgiveness and presence. The children (and adults!) can look forward to children's time with Krista and Revy. Young to older will be drawn into worship through our visual arts that Loanne Harms will be creating. We invite everyone to come to our Lenten journey with an open heart and mind to meet Jesus and to be transformed as together we seek God's ways.

Again this year we encourage everyone to utilize the resource, Lenten Guided Prayer 2022, made available from the Mennonite Spiritual Directors of Eastern Canada. This resource provides an opportunity to integrate prayer and scripture into daily life. As so many of the Biblical texts for Lent 2022 remind us, God's ways are often different and wonderfully surprising compared to our expectations and assumptions about God. You will be encouraged to delve more deeply into God's longings for us. These materials, suitable for individuals or small groups, will be emailed out to the congregation weekly, beginning Friday, March 4. A limited number of paper copies will be available at the participation station table beginning March 6. If you have trouble opening the attachments or need to arrange for a paper copy of these devotionals, please contact Janet in the church office.

A reminder that we will begin our Lenten journey on March 2 with a 6:30 p.m. Ash Wednesday Service in our sanctuary (it will also be live streamed). We will mark each other with ashes as signs not only of our mortality but also of forgiveness and new life.

More details will come later for special services during Holy Week. May we join together in prayer for this intentional time of "Seeking God's Ways."

Introduction to Pastor Frances

Life began for me in Upland, Ind., where my father was a professor at Taylor University. My parents and older brother and sister were immigrants from Latvia and I was the 'little American' born in this country. My mother died when I was nine and my father was disabled by a series of strokes when I was a junior in high school. Supportive Christian community was vital in my growing up years.

I attended Taylor University where I met my husband Ron. After he completed graduate work at Ohio State we moved to the Minneapolis area where our two sons were born. Next steps took us to Wheaton, Ill., where we connected with Lombard Mennonite Church and deeper connection to Mennonites. We both became involved in church leadership roles and I was drawn particularly into worship planning. While living in Wheaton our eldest son, Ross, developed a serious progressive neurological condition.

On my 40th birthday our small group strongly encouraged me to seek formal theological training. I received an MA in Biblical and Theological Studies from Wheaton College with credits from AMBS. In 2003, with a major life transition, we moved to Elkhart County where

Ron was employed at AMBS and I was able to earn a Masters of Divinity degree. In 2010 I joyfully became part of the pastoral team at Prairie Street Mennonite Church where I served until the end of 2019. In the spring of 2021 I was invited to serve as interim pastor for East Goshen Mennonite Church and later that year for First Mennonite in Indianapolis. The opportunity to do interim pastoral work is an unanticipated blessing.

Our son Ross with the strong support of classmates was able to graduate from Taylor and work at Everence for almost ten years before his increasing disability limited fulltime employment. Always seeking to maximize opportunity, he travelled with a friend to Scotland in November 2016 where he contracted an infection and died there a month later. Ron and I spent that month in Edinburgh at his bedside, again supported and blessed by Christian community.

Our younger son Joe is married and lives in Vermont with his wife Rachael and four young daughters. We take deep delight in opportunities to visit and grandparent. I also take delight in gardening, sharing plants and engaging our downtown Elkhart neighborhood.
