#### **Faces of Our Faith**

During worship on May 8, we will send off Pastor Katie with our love and prayers as she begins her three month sabbatical. Katie's sabbatical theme is "Spillin' the Tea: telling a more compassionate story." As a congregation we seek to join Katie this summer by embracing the opportunity to also dwell with this overarching theme. One significant way we will enter this theme is through our summer worship series: Faces of Our Faith.

Beginning on May 15, each Sunday we will spend time exploring bold and often overlooked biblical characters. We will be invited to sit with characters such as Adam & Eve, Shiprah & Puah, Daughters of Zelophehad, Lydia, Eutychus and more. Through storytelling, visual arts and music, we will enter into the lives of biblical men and women and learn what shaped their faith and formed their experiences with God and with God's community. Through entering their stories we will be led to enter a more compassionate story of God's love for each one of us and for all of creation.

There are five unique ways we are invited to actively engage our series of "Faces of Our Faith."

- Devotional Booklets: On May 8 we will have printed copies of a devotional journal that corresponds to our worship series and may be used devotionally or in a small group/Sunday School class.

Sarah Augustine Collaboration at Goshen College: Goshen College will be hosting Sarah Augustine from November 7-11, 2022. The hopes for the conference are: cultivating relationships and furthering the work of repair between our community and Indigenous people; celebrating Native America Heritage Month; to have a week of teaching, connecting, exploring engagement and capacity building; and to provide students and community members opportunity to engage in restorative relationship building with Indigenous people. Amount given: \$1,500.00

Renovation costs for Thrift at Woodland Crossing (Elkhart MCC store): Renovation costs have exceeded what was originally thought and more funds are needed to get the store up and running. Projected renovation costs are now approximately \$300,000 with around \$91,000 having been raised. An estimated opening date is June 2022. Amount given: \$4,400.00
