Mennonite World Conference

Did you know ...

Nearly 100 years ago, in June 1925, a group of about 40 Mennonite leaders from 7 European countries got together for several days of worship and conversation. They wanted to reestablish a common sense of identity after World War I—a war that brought Mennonite soldiers from France, Germany, Poland, Ukraine and North America into mortal combat with each other. As a step towards healing relationships, the group agreed to collaborate in responding to the material and spiritual needs of Mennonites in the Soviet Union who were suffering from famine, imprisonment and the murder of hundreds of their members.

This modest gathering marked the beginning of the Mennonite World Conference. Representatives of various Anabaptist-Mennonite groups have continued to meet on a regular basis to hear stories, share each others burdens, and be challenged and inspired by testimonies of Christian discipleship in different settings.

Every six years MWC hosts a global family reunion. Recent assemblies have been hosted in India (1997), Zimbabwe (2003), Paraguay (2009) and Harrisburg, PA (2015). This year Mennonites from all over the world gathered in Salatiga, Indonesia to celebrate the 17th Assembly of Mennonite World Conference. It reflected the
