

## **Repair Network Gathering with Sarah Augustine**

Sarah Augustine, founder of the Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery Coalition and author of “The Land is Not Empty,” will be in Goshen the second week of November. On Thursday, November 10, at 7:00 p.m., the Waterford DDoD group will host a gathering in the fellowship hall for local church groups and individuals to hear more about the Coalition and Repair Network from Sarah.

Katarina Gea, coalition organizer states, “The Repair Network is a growing network of Christian congregations and communities (including camps, universities, seminaries, or other groups) who commit to the journey of decolonization through ongoing learning, reparative actions, and solidarity with local and global Indigenous partners working for justice and restoration of land and life. We gather regularly as a Network for mutual learning and cross-pollination, to hear from Indigenous speakers and activists, and to organize together! We are seeking to build a movement to support the dismantling of ongoing colonization, and invite you to join us!”

As the WMC DDoD group looks toward joining the Repair Network, we invite anyone interested in learning what it means to be a Repair Congregation to attend the meeting. The meeting will be followed by a book signing.

This coming Tuesday the Stephen Ministry training class will be considering the subject of using mental health professionals and other community resources. During this session, they will be discovering the many and varied resources that exist in our community to help meet people's specific needs.

During a full day on Saturday, the class will be considering the subject of ministering to those experiencing grief. During this session, they will be helped to realize that grief can be healthy and taught to recognize and help people through the various stages of grieving. They will finish the day by considering their role when dealing with a care receiver who has depression. During this session, they will be looking into the very common problem of depression—its causes and symptoms, and the very special role Stephen Ministers have in the lives of people who are depressed.
