Holy Week at WMC

We continue in our journey through Lent as we join Jesus and the disciples making their way to Jerusalem. In our weekly worship we have continued to follow the Narrative Lectionary with our texts coming from the gospel of Matthew. In addition, each week we have included a different sound to help us engage more of our senses to aid us in digging deeper into the biblical stories.

Our Lenten journey leads us to Holy Week which will have added opportunities for us to gather, to reflect, to fellowship, and to worship.

April 2 – **Palm Sunday**, we will gather at 9 a.m. for worship with a special guest of a miniature donkey. Children will venture outside to our Remembering Life Garden for children's time before returning inside, waving branches while we sing. Nurture hour will follow at 10:30.

April 6 – **Maundy Thursday**, all are invited to share in a simple meal together in our fellowship hall at 6 p.m., followed by a service of footwashing. At the Participation Station you may sign up to bring food (soup, bread, or fruit to serve 8), as well as to help with set up or clean up from the meal.

Engaging the Powers

Pray with Apache Stronghold on March 19!

The Coalition to Dismantle the Doctrine of Discovery invites our community to join in prayer for Indigenous land justice with the Apache Stronghold on March 19. On March 21, a federal appeals court will hear a pivotal case about Apache religious freedom that centers around a proposed copper mine, which would destroy the Western Apache sacred site of Oak Flat, *Chi'chil Bildagoteel.* (For a synopsis of the case, read more here.) Mennonite Church USA and Pacific Southwest Mennonite Conference signed onto an amicus brief (a letter to the court) in support of the Apache Stronghold, along with other religious groups. The Apache Stronghold are rallying all people of faith and conscience under the call of "One Drum, One Prayer, One Circle," to seek unity in protection of Earth and in resistance to ongoing colonization by dedicating March 19 to prayer for them and this case. Here are two opportunities to do that:

- Sunday, March 19 at 2 p.m: Goshen College Newcomer Center. An event supporting and praying for the Apache Stronghold, defending its sacred lands against Resolution Copper. Please join in this event, and invite others from our community.
- Tuesday, March 21 at 6 p.m. Goshen College Rec-Fitness Center.

 This includes a prayer run/walk to the Goshen Dam for continued prayers.
