Last September we started following the assigned scripture readings of the Narrative Lectionary. The large arch of the beautiful and complex story of God's salvation story started in Genesis and the story of creation. As we traced this story we paused to sit with the stories of individuals, families, and large groups of people from Noah to Abraham to Esther to Mary. Leading up to Easter we walked through the gospel of Matthew, retracing Jesus' steps of ministry and his journey to Jerusalem.

Following Easter, our scripture texts in April and May will lead us to the books of Acts and Romans. This series, "Directions to the Kindom," will invite us to dig deeper into how the early church understood the calling to faithfully follow Jesus. We are grateful to continue to draw from the Scottish resource, "Spill the Beans," to accompany our worship with creative scripture readings, engaging dramas, and suggestions for liturgical elements of the service. In May our dramas and creative scripture readings will be combined as we hear from "Inner Paul" and the "Written Paul." Two highlights of the series will be on April 30 when members of our JYF lead us in worship, and on May 28 when we bless and celebrate with our high school graduates.

Young Adult Neurodivergent Support Group

Do you identify as a young adult and have autism, ADHD, social anxiety, Down syndrome, OCD, bipolar disorder, or other neurodivergent tendencies? Waterford is forming a young adult neurodivergent support group, which will meet on the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the young adult room.

The group, led by Emily Hunsberger, will focus on connecting with one another and learning how to thrive in a world that was not created for our brains. Each meeting will follow the same structure: we will start with a mindfulness exercise, followed by 5 - 10 minutes of learning a skill or tool. Then a pre-chosen member of the group will share about a hobby and lead the group in that hobby for 20 - 30 minutes. Each night will end with a mindfulness exercise.
