Welcoming Spaces

'Friends Don't Let Friends Give Cash'

In my work as a Stewardship Consultant at Everence, one of my colleagues is fond of saying, "Friends don't let friends just give cash."

His point is to note that while very few of us are generous primarily because of tax advantages, there is often a way to give that is more advantageous than simply writing out a check. By using intentional strategies, people of all ages and income levels can often be more generous than they otherwise thought possible.

On Sunday, May 28, at 6:30 p.m. at the church, I will be leading a workshop, "Strategic Generosity: Creative Ways to Maximize Your Giving." The event will also be livestreamed and recorded for those unable to attend in person. The link for livestreaming is: <u>Zoom link:</u> <u>Strategic Generosity workshop</u>.

In the workshop, we will focus our attention on the giving tools that provide immediate tax advantages and that support organizations now or in the near future. We will also consider strategies that can be helpful to individuals or organizations at a later date and even some that "give twice," providing a stream of income to the donor or heirs while providing immediate tax advantages and benefiting charity later. I will also share some updates related to the SECURE Act 2.0 tax legislation passed in late 2022 for effect in 2023.

It seems appropriate to have such a workshop as we invite people to generosity through our Welcoming Spaces 3.1 campaign, since people often use these tools when making special gifts. However, many Waterford individuals use one or more of these strategies for all of their charitable giving, including regular giving to Waterford and to other ministries they care about.

Learning New Songs from Voices Together*	Our new hymnal is full of amazing songs! This elective will meet in the sanctuary and explore some of the yet uncovered treasures within <i>Voices Together</i> !	Sanctuary
Outside Spiritual Practices**	Spending time in creation can be a spiritual discipline to connect with God and with others. For the first two weeks Pastor Deron will lead this group in our wetlands. The second two weeks will take place at Luke & Becky Gascho's orchards while Luke leads the group on a tour there.	June 4 & 11 the group will meet down by the pond in our wetlands. *Denotes electives that are designed to be intergenerational of all ages. We ask that children 5th grade and younger are accompanied by an adult to the elective of their choice. The adult could be a parent or grandparent, or just another adult in the congregation who will be with the child during the elective.

**Outside Spiritual Practices Elective is designed to be intergenerational of all ages 6th grade and older.

Dear Beloved Community,

I wanted to take this opportunity to thank you for your donation to the Coalition's salary fund so that I could come on board as the Executive Director. For decades, I have been working on decolonization, which I define as stepping back from the control and oppression of vulnerable peoples in ways that include changing financial structures, laws and policies, giving back land, and challenging centuries-old conventions and thinking.
