Welcoming Spaces 3.1 projects ready to move forward

Thanks to so many for the generous response to our Welcoming Spaces 3.1 plans for facility renovation.

Through June 11, we now have raised over \$230,000 of the remaining \$275,000 needed to complete the project, which includes a renovation of the fellowship hall and south restrooms and the addition of two individual restrooms. This total counts the grant we received from Indiana-Michigan Mennonite Conference, gifts already received and people's stated intentions to give.

At our May 14 meeting, we voted to move forward when we had reached at least 80 percent of the remaining need in cash and intentions. Our June 11 total provides nearly 84 percent of what is needed.

We are working with our contractor, John Mast Construction, to finalize the project details and will keep the congregation posted when we have an expected start date.

As I shared during the June 4 service, it has been inspiring to see the gifts and intentions to give from so many people. We have received gifts ranging from several dollars to several thousand and more, and all are valuable. We have received gifts and plans to give from cash, from Donor Advised Funds and from Qualified Charitable Distributions. We have received one-time gifts, gifts planned over several months or into next year and even from a household that has committed to giving monthly over 12 months.
