Seven households have made a first-time gift to our Welcoming Spaces projects in the past two months. With those, a total of 81 Waterford households have made a gift to either Welcoming Spaces 3.0 or 3.1. Thank you to this group of attenders who have joined with others in their generosity!

With those contributions and others, we have now received more than \$238,000 in gifts and stated intentions to give, moving us to more than 86 percent of our \$275,000 goal. Our gifts received include the grant proceeds from Indiana-Michigan Mennonite Conference's Capital Projects Fund.

Fellowship Hall deconstruction

Are you looking forward to having room dividers in the Fellowship Hall that actually close? Are you longing for the day when you don't have to stare at the 1970's school hallway floor tiles when no one in your Sunday School class has anything to say? Do you ever wish that your corner of the hall wasn't freezing in winter and suffocatingly hot in summer? Well, soon you will have a chance to do something about that!

Renovations are expected to begin in late August or early September. But before the contractors come, we will do the deconstruction with volunteers. From August 8 - 11 we will need a few volunteers to empty the hall of tables, chairs and everything in all of the closets. Then all entrances into the rest of the building will be sealed against traffic and dust.

On two Saturdays, volunteers are needed to remove the accordion doors (curtains) and moveable walls (August 12) and the ceiling tile and grid (August 19). Both of these days will require strong younger bodies, as the doors are heavy and the ceiling work is a lot of overhead labor.

During the week in between, we will need six to eight people each day to remove the floor tiles. Older volunteers would be better suited to this work, and positions and tasks can be rotated throughout the day. It will require N95 masks.

There are signup sheets at the participation station for each of these four tasks. Consider what you can do and when you can do it to help make this project happen!
