## **Worship Visual**

## What Is It?

Last Sunday there were a number of people who stopped to ask me, "What is it?" referring to the huge visual up in front in the sanctuary. One soul was kind enough to say they weren't sure what it was but trusted that if I was doing it, it would be meaningful. (Thank you)

Pastor Cindy introduced our current worship series, "Practicing our Faith," in the Buzz earlier this month. In it she quotes Dorothy Bass describing Christian practices as "shared patterns of activity in and through which life together takes shape over time in response to and in light of God as known in Jesus Christ. Woven together, they form a way of life..."

Our visual for this series draws upon some of these images; shaped over time, woven together, and patterns of activity. The huge weaving or tapestry is meant to represent a "way of life" with a strip added each week that represents the practice of the day. I chose colors and patterns to reflect the theme of each practice. Careful observation will find that today's fabric, while primarily black, is over-printed with music symbols that flow across it.

Within each strip you will find additional objects like a broken chain, a Masai necklace or a water bottle. These add-ons reflect the testimonies of the day. Like memories that surface when we reflect on Christian practices within our lives, these objects, these symbolic representations of the testimonies, help steer our encounters with God.

And it's huge because smallness doesn't serve us well as a way of life. We are called to add big chunks of our life to Christian practices, with each helping "to embody a specific wisdom about what it means to be a human being under God" as Bass describes.
