Construction Update

Thank you to all of the volunteers who helped in the last two weeks with the deconstruction! They worked hard and quickly, putting us ahead of schedule. They removed all of the moveable walls, ceiling, wall tracks and headers, bathroom fixtures and cleared away the piles of trash. And thank you to Bob Hochstedler who is overseeing the work and has put in many hours in the last three weeks to keep this project on track!

Last week, the contractors began their work, cutting into the concrete to expand the drainage pipes under the floor, and the plumbers have begun reconfiguring and adding pipes to accommodate the relocation of the fixtures in both the existing and new restrooms. That work will continue into next week along with the framing of walls around the new restrooms.
