SAVE on Air Tickets (and help out our church budget)!

If you are planning to travel by air in the next couple of months, have I got a deal for you!

In the spring of this year, the BBI Planning Group purchased two tickets with United Airlines for Beninese delegates whom we were expecting in Goshen this fall. We had already purchased the tickets when we learned that the waiting line to obtain visas to the USA was many months long, and that our friends from BBI would not be able to receive their visas on time in order to make use of the tickets we had already purchased.

After multiple unsuccessful attempts by our travel agent to receive reimbursement for the tickets, he learned that the tickets can be used in the following circumstances:

- Value of each ticket cannot exceed \$1130 U.S.
- Names and destinations on the tickets can be changed
- Travel needs to begin on or before March 15, 2024
- The entire itinerary must be booked with United Airlines.

If these conditions fit into your travel plans, would you consider working with me to purchase these tickets? Whatever we can recoup from this purchase will be reimbursed to WMC's "BBI Activities" line item and will help us with future expenses. We could provide a cost reduction of \$250/ticket to make the extra hassle worthwhile for you.

The demonstrations are part of an international Day of Mennonite Action for a Ceasefire, organized by Mennonite Action.


