Meet Jerry and Joyce Troyer



Joyce grew up in Archbold, Ohio and was a member of Zion Mennonite Church. She graduated from Goshen College with a degree in Education. She met Jerry at Goshen College and they were married July 19, 1969. She taught in elementary schools in Ind., and Wyo. In 1974 they moved to LaJunta, Col., where, after a year of teaching, Joyce stayed at home to raise their two sons. Upon returning to the Goshen area,

Joyce eventually worked as an administrative assistant at MMA (now Everence), Goshen College, and the Greencroft Foundation. When they returned to Col., she worked at Northern CO Water Conservancy District and then as a part-time companion caregiver. Upon retirement, Joyce volunteered at the Ten Thousand Villages store in Fort Collins. After moving to Ariz. in 2015, she volunteered occasionally at International Rescue Center, an organization that was a service to immigrants seeking asylum. Joyce enjoys reading, riding her bike, playing pickleball, skiing, and going out for coffee/lunch with friends.

Jerry grew up in Lancaster County, Pa., and was a member of the Maple Grove Mennonite Church. He attended Hesston College and graduated from Goshen College with a degree in Business. He also got a law degree from the University of Wyoming (1971-1974). He mostly worked in healthcare administration at Goshen Hospital, LaJunta Medical Center, Huerfano Memorial Hospital in Walsenburg, Col., MMA (now Everence) and Goshen Health System. He was also Director of Laurelville Mennonite Church Center, in Pa. Service organizations he has been involved with are Kiwanis and Rotary. He enjoys outdoor activities: biking, hiking and backpacking, skiing, hunting and fishing. He also enjoys researching many topics on the internet.

Jerry and Joyce lived in Goshen from 1980 to 1999 where they raised their two sons, Ryan and Jeff. The west was calling their names again, so they moved back to CO in 1999 and in 2015 they moved to Sun City, AZ until November of this past year, 2023. For almost all of their 54 years of marriage, they have been members of a Mennonite Church. Staying with the Anabaptist vision and values has always been an important part of their lives.

Ryan, their eldest son, along with his wife, Patti, and their son, Evan, live in London, Ont., Canada. Both Ryan and Patti are assistant professors at Western University in London.
