Many times, church gatherings can have a heavy feel. Weighty decisions are being made about who we understand God to be. Who we understand our neighbor to be. Or long-standing friendships and relationships seem to be at risk. The very heart of Jesus is in flux.

But not always...

Summer Fest 2024 in Indianapolis had a light, joyful feel. And it wasn't just the name change from the mundane Annual Gathering, to the free and inviting Summer Fest. There were youth participating. The host church, Mara Christian Church of America, exuded warmth and a sense of optimism about their growing congregation and the work being done within the Mara community in Indy. First Mennonite Church of Indy led upbeat worship with a band ranging in age from 13 to 60. And sure, a budget was passed, minutes were approved, and committees were joined. And the agenda included a lesson on a third way between unanimity and division. A pathway together based upon consensus. Consensus is an acceptable outcome for all to move forward. The IN-MI spring meetings provided a time for questions, conversation, responses, and testing consensus. And when Summer Fest's agenda called for a vote, they turned out to be unanimous. Surely agendas in future years will be more contentious than this year. But a vision for consensus offers hope. Yet the spirit of this gathering was not an agenda nor any particular votes. Racial Justice Pilgrimage: South Africa, October 15-28, 2024. Church groups, friends and family are invited to join in exploring South Africa's beauty and culture as we learn the country's history and its ongoing struggles while pursuing peace and reconciliation.

Raise funds to replace olive tree in Palestine. Israelis have destroyed over one million olive trees belonging to Palestinians. Why? To strike at their livelihoods, create economic hardships, and displace them from their land. Once trees are removed and farmers are forced to leave their land, Israelis may claim and add this land to their settlements in occupied Palestine. This is one of many aggravating factors leading to Palestinian resistance and the current war. Help MennoPIN and the Mennonite Men JoinTrees campaign raise \$50,000 to replace 2,500-3,000 olive trees and enable Palestinian families to remain on their land.

Mennonite Action Prayers at College Mennonite Church on Tuesday, July 16, will include times of prayer in song, spoken prayer, silence, scripture, and candle lighting. This month we will meet in the sanctuary from 12 noon to 1 p.m. In addition to praying for peace in Gaza and throughout the world, we will pray for those Mennonites and other Anabaptists and Allies who will be "marching in the light of God" from Harrisonburg, Virginia, to Washington, DC. They will use bodies and voices to bring messages of peace through the hills of Virginia and to the halls of power. We will also pray for the Mennonite Action activities in Washington, DC, between July 28 and 30, which will include joining a multifaith coalition to peacefully call for a permanent ceasefire.
