

Our small group consists of four couples in their 70's and very low 80's, all with children long gone from home and with children of their own. We began meeting a number of years ago as support for one of the couples at a stressful time and then just naturally moved into being a group of mutual support with whatever we were encountering in our life journeys.

We meet every four to five weeks, beginning with a meal together, and rotate among meeting at each of our homes. The hosts are responsible for the main dish and perhaps suggesting a topic or question we may want to entertain after the meal. Usually, during the meal together we catch up with each couple, listening to the mix of blessings and challenges faced in the last month and what might lie ahead. The fifth month we go out to eat together at a restaurant someone suggests.

It is important to us that our group foster personal growth and that is one of the purposes of focusing on a topic or a thought-provoking question to respond to. We try to be open to being stretched in our thinking and behavior. We have a high level of trust for each other and seek to be a safe place for us to process how we are dealing with the issues/challenges we are each facing in our lives. At this point we are satisfied with continuing with the present number in our group.

Assistance Needed for Gaza Family

You may remember that Tareq Abuhalima from Gaza spoke to the Seekers Sunday School class and other interested parties on September 8. He shared his story of how he came to Bluffton College from Gaza and his history of education and involvement in various non-profit organizations there before coming to the U.S. He introduced us to at least five people who had been influential in his development and who became his friends. He shared his devastation each time he learned that each one of them and also two of his sisters had been killed in the bombings. His family members' homes and properties have been destroyed and they are now living in tents in the last area of Gaza along the beach that had not yet been bombed. (They have since learned that area is the next to be targeted.)

Their immediate need is for money to buy food. Some food is available to buy, but at high prices, and it can only be purchased for cash. Tareq has found intermediaries who can get money to his family, after taking 25% off the top for exchanging it to local currency. He confirms by cell phone that his family received the money he sent.

If you feel led to contribute toward the needs of his mother, his ten surviving siblings, and their children (59 individuals), you can do that by donating through Waterford Mennonite Church and designating it for Gaza Relief Fund. (These contributions would not be tax deductible.)

Note: The Mission Service Ministry Team has approved giving monetary assistance toward this family's needs through their miscellaneous fund.
