# Visual thoughts

When thinking about the visual for "Seeking Peace Together" God was central to that image. I believe God is full of love, compassion, grace and forgiveness, a true embodiment and source of peace. Over the years I have come to envision God as light and warmth, often as a comforting hug that surrounds me like a cloud. For this visual, then, I have placed a lighted candle—a source of light and warmth—in the center to represent the light and love of God's peace. This is within a sheer blanket, full of yet more light representing the mystery, yet comforting presence surrounding God's peace.

I wanted a visual that basically stayed the same—God's presence and peace is central to all four of the series themes—but that had small changes for each theme. We started with "Peace with God." Simply, the lights and swirls of airy cloth represented our central belief that God brings and embodies peace.

The introduction of the two hands led us into the second part of this series, "Peace Within." The hands were created by Arianna Pérez Diener, Anna Smucker, and me quite a few years ago for an Advent visual. Here they sheltered the light of God within their embrace as scripture and sermon guided us to think about the peace of heart and mind that comes with trusting in God's presence and love.

Those hands now open to "Peace with Others." Still staying close to the presence of God's love and light, we now engage with community as peacemakers, forgiving, listening, and responding in difficult relationships and circumstances with love and creativity. Although a simple visual, the work of peace with others remains difficult. (Maybe
