Advent 2024: "Together on the Journey"

December 1 marks the beginning of the season of Advent. During this liturgical season of the church, we will join believers around the world in a time of watching, waiting, preparing, and expecting. Once again, this year we will use the worship resource in The Leader, a periodical produced by MennoMedia. For the first time, The Leader will be following the assigned texts from the Narrative Lectionary instead of the Revised Common Lectionary. We are excited about this opportunity to enter the familiar season of Advent with unfamiliar pairings of biblical stories.

The theme this year is "Together on the Journey." The resource planners, from Mennonite Church Canada, noted an overarching theme to the responses of the biblical characters in this year's Advent lectionary scriptures, inviting others to walk "together on the journey." In their introduction they write, "This theme found in scripture readings starts with persistently walking with God (Advent 1) and being open to the guidance of God's Spirit (Advent 2). Then the theme extends to including the marginalized (Advent 3), the support of others (Advent 4), those who help us 'see' what God is doing (Sunday after Christmas), and mentors who teach us along the way (Epiphany)."

For this Advent we have invited intergenerational pairs to serve as our worship leaders, a tangible representation of how we are together on the journey. Behind the scenes, mentor/mentee pair Zoë Brown and Layna Stoltzfus will be creating our weekly worship visual arts.

We welcome you on this journey of Advent as we once again prepare to fully welcome and celebrate the arrival of Emmanuel.
