New Children's Books in the Church Library

25 Days to Jesus: A children's advent devotional, by Christy Waltersdorff and Mitch Miller.

We Are Water Protectors, by Carole Lindstrom and Michaela Goode. This Caldecott medal winning book honors indigenous-led movements across the world, a rallying cry to safeguard the Earth's water from harm and corruption.

White Flour, by David LaMotte. The story of an effective response to a racist rally in Knoxville, TN, in 2007. Rhyme and evocative illustrations inspired by true events tell the story of the Coup Clutz Clowns who vanquished the KKK. The group overcame hatred with humor. This is a story of a non-violent approach to aggression. Illustrations balance the seriousness of the topic.

God's Holy Darkness, by Sharei Green and Bekah Selnicks. The authors deconstruct anti-blackness in Christian theology by celebrating instances in the story of God's people when darkness, blackness, and night are beautiful, good and holy. Children learn that blackness is something to celebrate as an element of the life of faith. Perfect for reading and anti-racist reflection.

Maybe God is Like That Too, by Jennifer Grant and Benjamin Schipper. In this award winning story, a young boy learns that God can be found in all kinds of moments, all you have to do is look at the people around you.

Waterford's Mennonite Women, formerly known as WMSC, or Women's Missionary and Service Commission, is typically a group of ladies, although men would certainly be welcome, that meet every second Thursday of the month from 8:30 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. We come and go as our schedule allows. While we're together, we quilt on a quilt for the Michiana Mennonite Relief Sale, knot comforters that are donated to the Mennonite Central Committee (MCC)) Material Resource Center, knit or crochet prayer shawls, sew school kit bags, or occasionally work on another project. While we're working, we laugh together, share from our lives and experiences, and give support and encouragement to each other. When it's nearing lunch time, we pause for a short devotional and business meeting. We collect a "Least Coin" offering, the funds from which we donate to a local cause of our choosing. After our meeting we share a potluck lunch together with pastors and office staff.

Mennonite Women organizes WMC's drives for MCC School Kits in the fall and MCC Relief Kits around Christmas time. We provide a baby quilt when a new baby is dedicated in a Sunday morning service and the prayer shawls that are given by our pastors to people experiencing a difficult time or a time of transition. We would welcome others to join us as we work together.

Grief Support Groups

There are two different ways to find companionship and support for your losses and your griefs.

An impromptu group has formed of mostly WMC members who have recently lost a spouse either to death or to dementia. This group gives mutual support and encouragement to those who have built a deep friendship on their journey of pain and loss.

At Greencroft, there are ongoing grief support groups. Some are held at the Community Center and some at Evergreen Place, Assisted Living. Both groups invite anyone from the Greencroft Campus and from other communities. Ursula Hess alternates with Goshen Hospice in leading these groups. Each one is usually six to seven weeks long. Interested people can contact Ursula Hess or one of the Chaplains at Greencroft.
