Benin Bible Institute Farm Hog Barn Gets Roof Rod Hollinger-Janzen

BBI's farm, which is intended to serve the dual purposes of training students in agriculture and generating income for BBI, recently benefited from a couple of generous WMC donors to put a roof on its hog barn.



In September 2024, during the visit of BBI delegates Germain Dossou and Jocelyne Ahoga, they shared about the difficulty the farm was facing, wanting to increase hog production but not having adequate shelter from the hot tropical sun.

Within a couple of weeks following their visit, two Waterford members made donations which have allowed BBI to purchase needed materials and to roof the barn.

MCC Relief Kit Project

Everyday in the news, we are reminded of many who are forced to leave their homes with little or nothing. One way we can be helpful is to provide relief kits through MCC. If you, your family or small group have not already gathered these items, please do so this month. They will be collected on Sundays, January 19 and 26.

Please remember to only include the items listed below. There have been some changes in the items requested since last year.

Each kit should include all of the following (all new items please):

- 4 large bars bath soap (leave in wrapper) *No hotel or mini soap bars*
- Shampoo; 1 or 2 bottles totaling more than 20 ounces each (place in a re-sealable plastic bag) *No hair conditioner*
- 4 large bars laundry soap (such as Fels Naptha[®], Sunlight[®], or Zote[®] brands) No powdered laundry detergent
- 4 adult-sized toothbrushes (in manufacturer's packaging) No child size or small toothbrushes and no toothpaste
- 4 new bath towels (medium weight, dark or bright colors preferred, approximately 28 inches x 50 inches) *No face towels or cloths*
- 2 wide-toothed combs (6-8 inches) No men's pocket combs
- 1 nail clipper (good quality) No full nail care kits or nail files
- Adhesive bandages (minimum 40)
- Sanitary pads (THIN; 1 or 2 packages, minimum 28 pads total) *No panty liners*

There can also be no personal notes or family photos. Dealing with custom officers can be difficult, so MCC staff needs to make the kits as uniform as possible.

Completed kits should be put in clean trash or large grocery bags. Individual items are also welcome and can be placed on a table by the library. All donations will be collected on Sundays, January 19 and 26. There are printed lists of items on the first table under the mailboxes.

Invitation to Join Eagle Scout Project

Luke, Elijah and Thomas Voth

We are part of BSA Troop 5 (formerly called Boy Scouts) that meets downtown at Goshen First Church. I, Luke, am the Assistant Scoutmaster and Elijah and Thomas are members of the troop. We are writing to invite the congregation to participate in Jack Woodiel's Eagle Scout Project of collecting baseball hats to be donated to pediatric cancer patients at South Bend Memorial Hospital. Jack is a member of our troop and is a cancer survivor.

Jack shares:

"On June 17, 2022, a golf-ball-sized tumor was found during my physical for Boy Scouts Summer Camp. Two doctors and five appointments later, it was removed on July 29 and sent to pathology. It turned out to be a rare pediatric cancer: embryonal rhabdomyosarcoma. It is a soft-tissue cancer that can be found anywhere in the body. About 500 cases are diagnosed annually in the United States. On September 8, I had 30 lymph nodes removed from my abdomen, followed by 20 infusions over 22 weeks started on November 2. On April 12, 2023, the final scan came back clear and I have been in remission since. It was a challenge from beginning to end, and I am forever grateful for the prayers and support I received.

Today, as a member of BSA Troop 5 in Goshen, Indiana, I am working on my Eagle Scout Project. The idea of doing something to help the hospital that provided wonderful care to me and all other cancer patients resounded in my head. After talking with them and learning that teen cancer patients in particular have fewer projects directed toward them, I finally decided to do a baseball hat drive: collecting hats and then donating all of them to pediatric cancer patients at Memorial Hospital in South Bend, Indiana. Now, as I look back on my cancer journey, the love I felt when people gave me a baseball hat to cover up my hair loss during chemo was powerful and kept my spirits high. Today, I am hoping you consider donating a baseball hat."

We invite you to join in Jack's Eagle Scout project by donating a baseball hat.
