The end of 2024 brought to a close Liz Gingrich's service to the congregation's Stephen Ministry. Liz served for nine years on the Stephen Leader Team as it gave overall direction to the congregation's Stephen Ministry program.

Liz served by helping to recruit and select people to become Stephen Ministers and was involved in their training. She helped identify people in need of care and matched them with Stephen Ministers in one-to-one caring

relationships. Liz also served as a monthly Peer Group Supervision Facilitator, giving support, guidance and accountability to Stephen Ministers. Liz' thoughtful devotions and input to Continuing Education were very much appreciated.

When asked what was the most rewarding aspect of her time with Stephen Ministry, Liz replied, "I was deeply grateful to witness the healing presence of the Holy Spirit in the relationships between the Stephen Ministers and the people they were caring for, and in the care I felt between us working together as a Team of Leaders and Ministers.

"Observing how our Stephen Ministers prayed and prepared for each meeting with those they were accompanying was an inspiration to me in seeking to be more fully present to other people and to God."

Special Treat for Prairie View Elementary Staff

For the past 10 years WMC has had a special relationship with Prairie View Elementary School. We are one of three local churches who are in partnership with PVES through a program called "Supporting Our Schools" or SOS for short. Within our partnership, we are invited to support the students as well as the teachers and staff at PVES. Throughout the year, we do a variety of things within our partnership. Last fall there was an article that talked about the grants we make available to teachers, administered by our Marge Gingerich, who is the guidance counselor at PVES. In the fall we purchased 100 headphones for students who needed them for their testing. We keep a 'granola bar cupboard' stocked in the main office. The bars are offered to students who might arrive too late to get breakfast, or when needed throughout the day.

Our next opportunity to bless and support PVES is providing a special breakfast treat for the 95 staff members on Monday, March 17. This special treat is just to offer a word and gesture of gratitude and encouragement to all involved in the care, nurture, and education of the 430 students who attend PVES. There are two ways you can participate in this gesture of blessing and care. First, you can stop by the Participation Station to sign up to contribute food items for the breakfast (fruit trays to serve 10, containers of mixed nuts, bags of small wrapped candy, or special paper plates and napkins). A special thank you to members of Sojourners Class who are preparing homemade baked good items for the breakfast.

The second way you can participate in this gesture of blessing and care is to stop by the paper banner in the foyer on March 9 and 16 to write a note of encouragement and appreciation to the staff. We will hang the banner above the breakfast foods at the school.
