This fun evening will be happening on Sunday, May 18th, at 5:30 pm. This week you will find a form in your mailbox (extras at the Participation Station) where you can sign up to HOST the dinner or to be a GUEST in someone else's home for the meal. Hosts will choose how many guests to host in their homes (or backyards) and provide the main dish and drinks. Guests, on the other hand, will travel to someone else's house and will provide either a salad or dessert.

Completed forms can be returned to the collection box at the Participation Station no later than Sunday, May 4th. Hosts and guests will be paired by FMT and all will be notified by May 11th.
