Meet Willie and Charleen Kanagy



Charleen grew up in Bedford, Ohio, a suburb of Cleveland. She began to attend Friendship Mennonite Church when she was in high school. She became actively involved with Friendship's MYF. With the encouragement of the church leadership, she attended EMC (now EMU) for one year. Charleen earned her college degree in History Education by attending Urbana College

and taking several summer classes whenever possible. As history teaching jobs were hard to come by (unless you could coach), she also completed a degree in Special Education. She made a career out of teaching reading, Special Education, and American History to Middle School students. Her latest teaching job was at Grissom Middle School in the Penn Harris Madison district. Charleen retired in May, 2015.

Willie grew up on a small farm near West Liberty, Ohio. He attended Oak Grove Mennonite Church. His interest in production agriculture took him to Ohio State University where he earned a degree in Agricultural Education. The next twenty years were a combination of farming and teaching Vocational Agriculture to students, grades 9-12. In the Spring of 1989, Willie was offered the position of Assistant Principal at Bethany Christian Schools, so that summer the family moved to Indiana to begin a new chapter (or maybe a new book) of life. After nine years at Bethany, Willie joined the pastoral team at College Mennonite Church as the pastor of Finance and Administration. Willie retired in April, 2015. In 2017 Willie was diagnosed with Parkinson Disease. Progression has been relatively slow, for which we are grateful. Every six months Willie meets with a Parkinson Specialist at Rush Hospital in
