### **Grandma's Chew Bread**

Submitted by Rachael Hochstedler upon request after serving this at Wednesday game night.

Servings: 18; Yield: 3 dozen

1 pound brown sugar

4 eggs

2 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 cup chopped pecans (may also add shredded coconut or other nuts)

Step 1: Preheat oven to 400°F. Grease a 9x13x2 inch jellyroll pan.

Step 2: In a heavy saucepan combine the sugar and eggs. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until sugar is dissolved. [This scorches easily, so stay with it.] Remove from heat, stir in the flour, salt, vanilla, and pecans.

Step 3: Spoon mixture into the prepared baking pan and bake for 18 minutes in the preheated oven. Cool and cut into squares.
