Celebrating Pentecost

Next Sunday, June 8, Waterford will be joining 11 other Mennonite Church USA and 2 Church of the Brethren congregations for a Pentecost service. We will be meeting on the grounds of Goshen College. Here are some things you will want to know:

- We will be meeting on the Yoder/Kratz/Miller lawn as designated on the map on the next page. There will be some chairs available, but please bring your own lawn chairs or blanket if possible. Note: the rain contingency plan is in the College Mennonite Church chapel.
- For those who need assistance to get to the worship area, they should park in the Rec Fitness Center parking lot (accessible from 12th Street) and there will be golf carts to transport you.
- Pre-service music will begin at 9:15. The service will start at 9:30.
- Brightly colored dress to represent the flames of the Spirit at Pentecost is encouraged.
- There will be no formal childcare, but there will be a children's time during the service. Otherwise, restless children are welcome to play in the lawn between the worship space and the Rec Fitness Center.
- It will be a bilingual service.
- There will be an offering taken to be split between the Window, National Immigrant Justice Center in Goshen, and Center for Healing and Hope. Cash or checks are welcome. Checks should be made out to "Central District Conference" with "Pentecost" in the memo line.



Chupp Wins Award in MCC Essay Contest

Cori Chupp, a junior at Bethany Christian Schools, was one of three high school students who received an honorable mention for her essay addressing climate change in the annual MCC U.S. National Peace & Justice Ministries (NPJM) public policy essay contest.

Chupp writes in her essay, "Beyond Warming," about the harms of fossil fuels, as well as the need for alternatives like wind, solar and water energy. "As Christians, we are called to be in stewardship

of the environment around us. God created this beautiful green Earth and created us with the purpose of taking care of it."

The NPJM public policy essay contest, which is in its 26th year, encourages youth to explore and understand federal government policy issues while reflecting on how their faith engages with advocacy. The contest is open to Mennonite, Brethren in Christ and other Anabaptist youth of high school age and to all youth who attend Mennonite-related high schools within the U.S. and Puerto Rico.
