### **Welcoming Jocelyne and Germain to MC USA Convention**

We are getting excited to welcome Jocelyne Ahoga and Germain Dossou, delegates from Benin Bible Institute (BBI). This visit, unlike previous visits, would have the unique goal of having our BBI Delegates

participate in the national conventions of Mennonite Church Canada and Mennonite Church USA. Jocelyne and Germain visited with us in Goshen in the fall of 2024 before traveling to visit with our siblings at St. Jacobs Mennonite Church in Ontario.

After their visit last fall, during our debriefing zoom meeting with



leadership from St. Jacobs, we wondered about the possibility of inviting BBI to send delegates to North America during the summer of 2025. The BBI Board was excited about this possibility and unique learning opportunity of connecting with our broader denominations and being able to serve as international representatives with Mennonite Mission Network.

Since COVID, we have been experiencing considerable delays in our BBI friends being able to receive interviews at the US Embassy to apply for visas. Due to the quick turnaround, new delegates would not have had time to secure an interview and a visa. However, thanks to quick thinking from our friends at St. Jacobs, we remembered that Jocelyne

#### **Opportunities**

Since time immemorial, Western Apache and other Native peoples have gathered at Oak Flat, also known as Chi'chil Bildagoteel, for religious ceremonies that cannot take place anywhere else. This arid desert ecosystem is recognized as a **Traditional Cultural Property on the National Register of Historic Places** and was safeguarded from mining activities since 1955 through the actions of President Eisenhower. On May 27, the Supreme Court refused to hear a case to protect the Western Apache sacred site Oak Flat from destruction. The proposed mining operation not only poses a threat to indigenous sacred sites and religious practices, but would severely deplete and contaminate the area's vital water resources. **MCC and Creation Justice Ministries held a webinar** on Tuesday, June 3 to talk about **ways to help protect Oak Flat** from destruction.
