This time of year many families are starting to gather the school supplies needed for their children's coming school year. It is a good reminder that many in our world do not have this opportunity because of being displaced through no fault of their own. Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) shared that the need for school kits has increased, therefore they hope to double the amount collected last year.

YOU CAN HELP!! This Sunday you will find bags ready to be filled located on a table by the library. Please pick up one (or more) bags and bring it/them back full of the items requested. There are also orange notes you can pick up listing what is needed in each bag. Mennonite Women will be providing and adding the pencil sharpeners this year so they are the correct size MCC wants. Pencil sharpeners will not be on your supply list.

Maybe you can make this a family event and even encourage others to participate. If you do not feel you can fill a complete bag, bring as many of the items listed below as you wish. There will be a box for these extra supplies you want to donate on the table the next three Sundays. It would be helpful to have everything returned by Sunday morning, August 10.

School Kit Items (New items only)

- 4 spiral or perforated-pages notebooks
- (8.5 in x 10.5 in and 70 sheets)
- 8 new unsharpened pencils
- 1 ruler (flat, good quality; must indicate 30 cm; inch markings optional)
- 12 colored pencils (in packaging)
- 1 large eraser
- 4 new black or blue ballpoint pens

Each school kit provides a student with tools needed to learn as well as knowing there are caring persons who provided these supplies.

Opportunities

People across southern Bangladesh are dealing with the largest mass poisoning in human history (according to the World Health Organization). There are high levels of naturally occurring arsenic in large numbers of the drinking water wells throughout this area. Tens of millions of Bangladeshis are being slowly poisoned, leading to debilitating health problems, children with depressed mental development (similar in action to lead), and early deaths. Bill & Carole Schumacher (Bill previously worked in Bangladesh with MCC), along with a number of other MCC alum, are concerned to raise awareness and help address this problem. MCC no longer works in the part of the country affected by arsenic, but staff are well aware of the crisis and encouraged us to find another organization working to address it. When we learned another former MCC alum later went back to Bangladesh with large mission SIM (Society for International Ministries) and started an arsenic mitigation project to help people access safe water and medical care, we visited to check it out, and started partnering with them to expand their project.
