Sometimes we need to be reminded of what our baking can do for others. An hour or two can make a big difference in the lives of people around the world!

One batch (3 doz) of **Cookies** can provide winter clothing for a child in Syria,

OR school meals in Burundi,

OR 10 chickens for two families in India,

OR 10 fruit trees for a family in Bangladesh.

One **Pie** will provide an eco-friendly stove in Malawi.

Two Pies can start a garden in India.

Three **Pies** can provide emergency food for a family in Sudan.

One pan **Cinnamon Rolls** provides a school uniform for a student in Egypt.

Two pans **Cinnamon Rolls** provides books for a peace library. Three pans **Cinnamon Rolls** can stock a family pond in Cambodia.

These are only a few possibilities. Just think what you could do on a family night, or a small group project, or a Sunday school class party—or come up with your own ideas.

Baked goods are hot sellers at the relief sale. There are pans, bags, boxes, twist ties and ingredient labels for the different baked goods at the relief sale table by the library. Please be sure to pick up an information sheet on food safety regulations and how to package your items. #### Michiana Mennonite Relief Sale

The Relief Sale is only two weeks away (September 26-27) and there are lots of opportunities to support Mennonite Central Committee by participating in events, splurging on food and giving of your time. Here are some specific ways you can contribute:

- WMC is responsible for two booths at the relief sale. Volunteers are needed for Friday evening and Saturday to serve soft ice cream and sell both popped and unpopped bags of popcorn. Elementary and junior youth (perhaps with your mentor or other adult) are encouraged to sign up to sell popcorn and drinks in the quilt building. Sign up at the Relief Sale table by the library. - Last year, Michiana congregations and businesses raised \$43,637.25 through MyCC to support various projects. This year the My Coins Count funds will be designated to Food projects of MCC. Due to the wars and conflicts in many places on earth, the global crisis is getting worse. MCC helps make emergency resources available to families who are fleeing war and conflict, helps farmers deal with changing weather patterns and learn new ways to increase the yields of their crops, offers new ways for gardeners to grow fresh vegetables and shares animals that help families build up their flocks and herds to provide food and extra money for school and other needs. Bring your coins this and next Sunday morning to drop into the MyCoinsCount jug outside the main doors going into the sanctuary.
- Bid on an item at the **Quilt Auction** at the Michiana Mennonite Relief Sale. Come and view the comforters and quilts of all sizes, quilted wall-hangings, plus knitted and crocheted afghans on Friday evening, Sept. 26. Then bid either in person or online on Saturday morning beginning at 8:00. On Sunday, September 14, those looking for a harbor where waters are tranquil in these tumultuous times will gather from 7:30–8 p.m. at Walnut Hill Mennonite Church, 909 N. Sixth St., Goshen. We will pray with song, Scripture, candlelight, and stillness. "Within our darkest night, you kindle the fire that never dies away."

How can we be silent?! As people die of starvation in Gaza and the destruction continues, some of us want to do more than pray alone and give money for aid. Join a group of peacebuilders to **pray together in silence**, with spoken words, with scripture, and in song. We will pray not only for Gaza, but also for Ukraine and other places of violence, and for immigrants everywhere. The group will meet in the College Mennonite Church sanctuary on **Tuesday**, **September 16**, from noon until 1 p.m. All are welcome to come for the hour or for part of the hour.

Beechy Peace, Justice and Reconciliation Lecture: Valarie Kaur with Qais Essar. Goshen College will host civil rights leader, lawyer, and filmmaker Valarie Kaur for the annual Beechy Peace, Justice and Reconciliation Lecture on Wednesday, Sept. 17, at 7:30 p.m. in the Church-Chapel. Founder of the Revolutionary Love Project, Kaur has led national campaigns on hate crimes, solitary confinement, and immigration detention, and was honored at the White House's first Uniters Ceremony. The evening will also feature Afghan-American composer Qais Essar, known for his performances on the rabab, Afghanistan's national instrument. The event is free and open to the public, and will be livestreamed.
