Save the Date for Mennonite Action "To Build Our Courage Tour"

Where: Waterford Mennonite Church

When: Saturday December 13, 9 a.m.-3 p.m.

Why: To give us tools for building our courage to live out the teachings of Jesus in compassion, love, truth-telling and justice for all God's children, including through non-violent public action and advocacy.

Background: In spite of a tentative peace agreement, there is no assurance of peace for the people of Gaza who have suffered relentlessly since the Hamas attack on Israel 2 years ago and even long before that since the formation of the State of Israel in 1948. Since its formation as an organization in November 2023, Mennonite Action has united people across the Mennonite Church in lifting up their voices and taking non-violent action to call for the return of the Israeli hostages and for an end to the suffering of the Palestinian people. You may remember that in January 2024 several members from Waterford and other area churches joined a Mennonite Action in Washington DC when 135 people were arrested for taking part in an act of Civil Disobedience by singing hymns in the Capitol Rotunda. Mennonite Action has continued to build public awareness and keep up its pressure on Congress through other actions since then, and many of you have also been participating in the monthly Zoom calls that keep us connected through worship and invitations to actions we can take as individuals and churches.

Current situation: In addition to the ongoing destruction, killing, and mass starvation in Gaza, new challenges now face us here at home through the administration's policy of arrest, detention and deportation of immigrants without regard to human rights. Other vulnerable people are also in need of support. Valarie Kaur, a Sikh activist, who spoke at Goshen College a few weeks ago, challenged us to "Be brave with our love," and to ask ourselves "Who do we want to be in this moment of history?"

Makers Day on November 23


