October Congregational Meeting

Ministry Leadership Council

A congregational meeting was held on October 12 around tables in the Fellowship Hall where finger foods were shared. Welcome and opening prayer were by Rose Shetler, MLC co-chair. Luke Gascho from WMC Reparative Justice Group provided background and shared resources on reparations, including a three-point action platform for racial justice: truth telling, education, and reparations in Indigenous and Black Communities. Meeting participants engaged in table group discussions around the overarching question: How might WMC best pursue reparations in response to injustices past and present that result from the Doctrine of Discovery? No decisions were made regarding reparations at this meeting.

Rose shared background on the proposed revisions to the guidelines for Mennonite Education Fund (MEF) Aid Plan which congregants had received ahead of the meeting. A vote was called with a number of people voicing concerns, comments, and questions before the vote was taken. Pastor Cindy Voth and Rose responded to questions, and those in attendance were encouraged to add comments to the ballots. The vote results were as follows:

Yes, I affirm: 77 votes, 83.7%

No, I do not affirm: 13 votes, 14.1%

Abstain: 2 votes, 2.2%

These totals include 20 absentee ballot votes. (Please note, the results have changed slightly from what was announced at the end of the meeting due to a ballot recount.)

Advent 2025: "Be Amazed!"

November 30 marks the beginning of the season of Advent. During this liturgical season of the church, we will join believers around the world in a time of watching, waiting, preparing, and expecting. Once again, this year we will utilize the worship resource in "The Leader," a periodical produced by MennoMedia. Like last year, this Advent we will be following the assigned texts from the Narrative Lectionary instead of the Revised Common Lectionary. We are excited about this opportunity to enter the familiar season of Advent with unfamiliar pairings of biblical stories.

The theme this year is "Be Amazed!" The resource planners, from Mennonite Church Canada, noted that what all of the Biblical stories have in common is that they are amazing! "There is, in each of them, a common thread of God acting in powerful and astonishing ways. The responses seen in many of these passages and likewise evoked in us readers is that of awe. Be amazed!"

Within the weekly worship services we will dwell with the assigned biblical passages, learn a new hymn as we light the advent candles, and have a projected image each week that correlates to the specific theme of the morning. Behind the scenes, Loanne Harms and Kathy Miller will create our worship visual arts.

October Congregational Meeting: A Response from Ministry Leadership Council

For those who attended the October 12 Congregational Meeting, it became apparent that some were dissatisfied with the limited amount of engagement Ministry Leadership Council (MLC) had with the congregation in the revisions of the guidelines of the Mennonite Education Fund (MEF) Aid Plan. This came through in the questions and concerns raised in the meeting, and that 29% of the ballots included comments indicating a desire for a more robust process, both from those who voted yes and those who voted no to affirming the revisions.

MLC has concluded that we are not finished with the task of evaluating MEF and seeking congregational input. We are committed to finding the best plan for this important ministry while also supporting other needs and emerging ministries at WMC. We are just beginning to flesh out what a good MEF review process may entail. In the coming months, there will be opportunities for listening and sharing perspectives.

We ask for grace and forbearance with each other as a congregation as we discern and navigate what has historically been a divisive issue. We ask for your prayers for MLC — for wisdom from God who gives liberally to those who ask.
