Introduction to Ecuador Four Way Mission

On Sunday evening, September 28, 2025, we introduced the new Ecuador Four Way Mission to Waterford Mennonite Church. We recognized how significant the Waterford congregation has been as a vital partner in the work of Jane and Jerrell Ross Richer and their family serving with Mennonite Mission Network from 2014 to 2023 in the eastern Amazon rainforest region of Ecuador. Initially, we came to know this as Two Way Mission.

With the changing circumstances in Ecuador, it became increasingly unsafe for Jane and Jerrell to return to serve in the area that experienced an increase in dangerous activities. Their relationships to the Cofán indigenous people, built during their time in Zábalo, have continued to flourish and so for the last two years we explored ways to build on those strong connections. After many conversations with trusted leaders in the US and in Ecuador, the doors to a new ministry opened for us. We decided to transition to a new focus of providing university scholarships and leadership training for the Cofán people.

In August 2025, Four Way Mission, Inc., became incorporated in the state of Indiana as a nonprofit organization and was granted status by the IRS as a U.S. 501(c)(3) tax-deductible nonprofit organization.

In our meeting, we introduced our three Ecuadorian partners, Julián Guamán, Silvia Guamán and Klever Guevara, who initially invited us to build a partnership with their Ecuador Four Way Mission Foundation which they are simultaneously creating there. They spoke of the idea of a broader incorporation of the four ordinal points of God, Creation,

Communities and People and called it a more comprehensive Four Way Mission. They have offered to be our eyes, ears and heart in the disbursement of the funds we are currently raising here in our context.

With the prayer and financial support of Waterford Mennonite Church, the Mission and Service Ministry Team and many individuals in the congregation, we started providing scholarships in early 2024 and currently have 4 full time students enrolled in the Ruminahui University in Sangolquí located about 11 miles south of the capital city of Quito.

Jerrell introduced us to Betty and Kendra who are in the nursing program at the university preparing to serve the medical needs of their community which has no access to Cofán speaking healthcare providers in their village. The nearest clinic is a one-hour boat ride on the Aguarico river.



Betty writes: Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, thank you very much for the financial and spiritual support you have given me to continue my nursing studies. Thank you for your generosity; it is a great blessing and a reminder of God's love. I will pray for you that the Lord may reward you and fill you with health and joy.

Kendra writes: I'm very grateful to the brothers and sisters who are supporting us. Thanks to you, we have this opportunity to continue studying at Rumiñahui University Technological Institute. I'm very happy! Thank you.



We also met Tarquino and Milena who are studying in the teachers training program via satellite internet and are able to study from their homes in Zábalo. The community sees the importance of having teachers who speak both Cofán and Spanish to help them preserve their own language yet be prepared to communicate in Spanish with the rest of the people in Ecuador.



Tarquino writes: I want to express my sincere gratitude for the support you've given me during my undergraduate studies in Teaching and Educational Innovation at Rumiñahui University. I'm now in my fourth semester and am excited to have only one more semester left to complete my studies. Your support has been essential for me to continue with my academic goals and achieve my dream.

Milena writes: I dropped out of school years ago, and now, after many years, I am starting my studies again. I want to express my sincere gratitude to the brothers and sisters for the valuable support they have provided to the higher education of Cofán members who want to prepare for professional life.

Despite our limited resources, we dream of improving ourselves and contributing to the well-being of our people. Your solidarity opens academic doors and strengthens the hope, identity, and dignity of a community that strives to keep its culture alive and look toward a future with greater opportunities.
