

MELT-ing Together (Mennonite Education Listening Tour)

In January and February of 2026, a small group of listeners would like to hear what your perspectives are on the Mennonite Education Fund and reflections on the last congregational meeting. In that meeting, there seemed to be unfinished discussion related to the future funding choices available for those students interested in attending Bethany. With the introduction of larger state vouchers and the expansion of grades offered at Bethany in recent years, MLC would like to hear more from the congregation regarding the issues you see that have not been addressed.

Maybe you are more comfortable sharing one on one, at home, or at the Brew or in a small group. Our group called MELT (Mennonite Education Listening Tour) would like to hear from you. It may take just a few minutes, or as long as you need, for us to learn from your perspective and to add your voice to the conversation. Those persons listening have no agenda other than to get a clear understanding of your perspective.

The anonymous results will be shared with MLC in March, to help direct future decisions, discussion, and improvements to our MEF guidelines. We are a faith community, called to share in each others lives. Sometimes when money is part of the conversation, we find it challenging to understand each other's perspectives. But there is hope. The listening has already begun—around the table (with ice cream) and in other settings. Let's continue to learn from each other as we journey toward mutual support that embraces the future of our congregation.
