Renewal Leave for Pastor Deron

Waterford's pastoral sabbatical leave policy grants a 3-month sabbatical after five years of serving the congregation and every five years thereafter (i.e. 6th, 11th, 16th years, and so on). Within the policy are noted three reasons for why WMC supports pastoral sabbaticals:

1. To provide opportunities for pastors to experience a time of reflection on their calling, personal spiritual growth, nurture, and discernment of the congregation's future ministries.
2. To provide opportunities for the congregation to care about the health and ongoing ministry of pastors.
3. To provide opportunities for the congregation to nurture long-term pastorates and to enhance congregational goals and mission strategy.

This summer it will be time for Pastor Deron's first sabbatical at Waterford and he will be taking this renewal leave from June 28 to September 28. Later this spring, in a future Buzz article, Pastor Deron will be sharing more about his sabbatical hopes and plans.
